


The Greater Virginia Peninsula Homelessness Consortium (GVPHC) compiled the annual Housing Inventory Count (HIC) in conjunction with the Point In Time (PIT) Count on January 27-28, 2021. The pie chart illustrates the proportion of beds available by project type as reported for the 2021 HIC. Permanent Housing beds (RRH, PSH, and OPH) account for 67% of the GVPHC's housing inventory. The bar chart below demonstrates the utilization rates for each project type during the PIT Count. Together, the HIC and PIT Count provide needed information on how well the current level of housing inventory meets the community's housing needs.

The Housing Inventory Count also tracks how year-round housing resources are dedicated by household types. Permanent Supportive Housing projects predominantly serve households *without* children, with 80% of beds dedicated to single adult households. However, Emergency Shelter and Rapid Rehousing beds are split nearly evenly between households *with* children and households *without* children.

Between 2020 and 2021, Permanent Supportive Housing inventory grew by 29%, from 714 beds in 2020 to 920 beds in 2021. This increase is due to a 213 bed increase in the HUD VASH program, as well as a new PSH project operated by LINK of Hampton Roads and Williamsburg House of Mercy.


Overall, there was a 17% increase in the Emergency Shelter (ES) beds, from 444 ES beds in 2020 to 520 ES beds in 2021. One contributing factor for this increase is due to an influx of funding in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. CoC partners were able to provide Emergency Shelter (ES) hotel/motel projects to serve homeless households across the GVPHC.

The GVPHC also had a 30% reduction in Transitional Housing (TH) inventory due to the reallocation of one project with HELP, Inc. from TH to ES, and a project at Avalon that was not operating due to COVID-19 restrictions.



- Other Permanent Housing (Dark Blue)


GVPHC Housing Inventory Count
Total Beds 10-Year Trend




GVPHC 2021 Housing Inventory Count

Over the last 10 years, the GVPHC's Permanent Supportive Housing inventory has grown by 52%, demonstrated in the line chart.

In total, GVPHC's housing inventory has grown by 34% since 2012. Specifically, the GVPHC has increased from 1,281 total beds in 2012 to 1,722 total beds in 2021 across all project types.
