VSH manages six CoC scattered-site PSH programs providing rental assistance, housing stabilization-focused case management, and outreach services to chronically homeless households in the Greater Richmond Continuum of Care, the Southeastern Virginia Continuum of Care, and the Portsmouth Continuum of Care. VSH also manages a SSVF program in Richmond, Charlottesville, and Petersburg, VA that provides supportive services to homeless and at-risk of homelessness veteran households. In all these programs providing supportive services, 97% of households served do not return to homelessness.

2. Describe your organization’s (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in leveraging Federal, State, local and private sector funds.

VSH has administered grants from all sources for over 30 years, and is currently a recipient of several Federal, State and Local grants, including: six CoC PSH; three SSVF; one HOPWA; one Multi-Family Service Coordinator (MFSC), five DHCD HTF, one DHCD VHSP, two CDBG, one City of Norfolk, and one Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services (DARS) grant.

VSH also maintains a current contract with the City of Virginia Beach to provide Property Management and Supportive Services for the VB Housing Resource Center building. Recognizing the limitations of government funding, VSH maintains a Mission Advancement Team that pursues and manages foundation and private grants including partnerships with VCU Health, Sentara, and other healthcare partners; the Hampton Roads Community Foundation; United Way; community churches and synagogues; corporate and other grantors.

All contracts and grants are subject to internal and funder-led audits with maximizing the usage of the non-government funding to provide required Match amounts and covering household participant program costs that are not grant-eligible the highest priority. VSH revamped the way grants are designed, managed, and billed to eliminate deobligation and to maximize the number of households able to be served.

3. Describe your organization's (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) financial management structure.

Virginia Supportive Housing is a non-profit community development corporation governed by a Board of Directors. The organization's staff is led by an Executive Director who manages the directors of the organization's various departments: Housing Development, Property Management, Client Services, Finance, and Revenue.

The Grants Manager position, operating within the Revenue Department, coordinates grant-related processes between Finance and Client Services, and communicates

pertinent information to the Executive Director and Board of Directors. On an organizational level, VSH operates within multiple Continuums of Care, coordinating service efforts with the lead agency and other providers in each CoC.

VSH's Finance team adheres to the accrual bases accounting method of generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). Finances are tracked and managed in Quickbooks, and the organization's financial statements are audited annually by the Firm of Dooley & Vicars.

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

The Portsmouth Housing First Expansion is a permanent supportive housing program for single adults experiencing chronic homelessness that leverages partnerships with landlords in the community. This approach allows households freedom of choice in selecting their housing and services. This expansion grant will add 3 CH households to the existing project and will pay for a portion of the existing case manager and housing specialist.

Supportive services are delivered by a housing stabilization team that provides in-home support, independent living skills training, linkage to available and appropriate benefits, linkage to medical care, linkage and provision of behavioral and mental health care, tenancy stabilization services, landlord mediation, connection to community resources, vocational services, and coordination of care. VSH partners with the Department of Social Services (DSS), Portsmouth Department of Behavioral Health (DBH), regional Housing Authorities, Bon Secours Care-a-Van, The Planning Council, Veterans Administration, OASIS, and community health clinics.

Households participating in the Housing First program will also be evaluated annually for Move On eligibility, a program component that reviews each household to determine what level of supportive services are required for that household to remain stable and permanently housed. For households that are interested in other mainstream housing options and have been evaluated to be eligible for Move On, supportive services staff will work with that household to begin the process of seeking other housing options, including accessing public and income-based housing, obtaining sufficient employment, and reunification with family and/or friends per the household’s choice.

4A. Supportive Services for Participants

1. Describe how program participants will be assisted to obtain and remain in permanent housing.

Households will be identified through the Portsmouth Coordinated Assessment Network (PCAN), the CoC's coordinated entry system. Once their eligibility is confirmed, the VSH supportive services staff will coordinate with existing and new community landlords we maintain partnerships with to identify apartments that meet client choice, as well as HUD HQS and rent reasonableness standards using the HUD HQS, rental calculation, and utility allowance forms.

Each household will be assessed at Intake to determine that their unique needs with detailed in-person assessments designed to identify that household's existing resources, potential barriers, eligibility for mainstream resources, and individual goals and expectations for housing stability. After housing placement, housing stabilization services are provided once a week during the first three months and will allow the services staff and household to develop an initial housing stabilization plan unique to their individual situation. As mental health and substance abuse treatment services remain voluntary, supportive services staff will provide the household on information regarding such resources. The SOAR-trained services staff will also work with the household to obtain income, non-cash, and health benefits for which they are eligible as well as assistance obtaining payee services if that household's situation calls for it.

Life skills training provided by VSH staff may include in-person trainings on budgeting, household maintenance, maintaining positive tenant-landlord relationships, and connections with community supports.

2. Describe the specific plan to coordinate and integrate with other mainstream health, social services, and employment programs for which program participants may be eligible.

After program entry, VSH staff assess individuals who enters the program to determine the household's needs, including health, social services, and employment and volunteer opportunities. The supportive services staff will utilize annual assessments and dialogue to connect the households with community partners that offer the needed services, including Medicaid/Medicare, and SNAP as eligible. Additionally, SOAR-certified staff work with the households and the mainstream providers to coordinate access to benefits such as SSI/SSDI/SSA. These staff are responsible for working with the household in applying for these eligible benefits and the appeals process (if needed). Supportive services staff will coordinate with agencies and assist with transportation needs, obtaining documentation, and completing applications. VSH also has volunteers that specialize in workforce development training and other related activities who work with households as appropriate.
